Background

The Houndwood community Group continues to work towards their aim of 'Making Houndwood a better, safer place to live in and caring for our environment and neighbours, encouraging a spirit of community amongst the residents of the 398 diverse housing units on our Icon/Houndwood Estate.

Finance

We have attached our latest set of accounts. The committee are very. grateful to Street Parish Council for their contribution to our running costs. We also continued to utilize equipment and material provided by Mendip District Council in the form of two grants that were awarded to us in 2022 (but partially spent in 2023). Thanks too to LiveWest who gave us a donation towards our community events. Donations from residents are also much appreciated. Having residents from diverse backgrounds means we feel unable to charge a membership fee as this might exclude some residents from joining in our activities.

Estate Management

As most residents are aware, Premier Estates are currently managing the common areas on the estate that are not designated road or paths. Their contractor Avery Landscapes manage most of the common areas; however, some areas and trees are not included in their contract.

The environment of our Icon/Houndwood Estate makes for a nice place to live, surrounded by waterways and mature trees. We are still very disappointed by the inadequate nature of Premier Estate's support especially to the trees, waterways, and nature area maintenance.

Road repair is still an outstanding issue on both halves of the estate. The two developers, Crest Nicholson and Barratt Homes will have to repair them before Somerset Council adopts them. There still doesn't seem to be any progress on this.

Communication with residents.

We published two newsletters in 2023, one in the Spring and one in the Winter. Several flyers were distributed to all houses advertising events, see events below. We continue to use the three noticeboards, updating them on a regular basis. Facebook is very active and the main port of call for many residents. Our website has a lot of useful and interesting information for residents.

Events

Annual General Meeting. Our AGM was held online on 24th June 2023

Events on the Green. We decided to have three picnics on the green, one for the Coronation on 8th May and one called "Gather on the Green", to celebrate the summer on 8th July and 28th August, one with rain, one without. We have two large tents to keep the rain off and committee members provided games for the children to play, archery, rounders, Jenga, parachute game and Connect Four plus many others. Prizes were given.

Halloween. (31st October) We had a competition to encourage residents to decorate their houses and roads. Congratulations to the winners, prizes were awarded to the best and most novel. It is always great to see all the children dressed up and trick or treating on the estate each year.

Christmas decorations. Another competition for residents with prizes given for best road, best house, and best window/balcony. It was great to see so many residents joining in.

Ecology Group

We encouraged residents to be involved in "**No Mow May**". We had a **nature event** on 26th July counting butterflies, bugs and identifying birds. **Bat Walks** were carried out on 21st April. We have three bat detectors to enable this. There are huge numbers on the estate which fly certain paths around us. We continued to look after the **bird boxes**, those used need cleaning once a year. We used our endoscope to check which ones had been nested in, 12 had been. One of our two **hedgehog** boxes was used, we suspect by a mouse.

Gardening Group

The gardening group has continued to utilise all the equipment purchased with the Mendip Grant for 2022. The greenhouse is being used to produce abundant plants. Bulbs were donated by residents to increase the amount around the estate. Our own compost is now being produced. Most of the planters on the estate are maintained by the gardening group. Plant donations are also gratefully received and plants transplanted around the estate for the best effect. If the sun is out so our gardening team.

Litter

Monthly litter picks are carried out if it is not raining. We have been doing this for 10 years on the estate. In addition, many residents pick up litter when they see it. If you would like to join us, just look out for posts on noticeboards and Facebook, we have all you need to do this safely and it is quite addictive once you start. Items are then collected by Somerset Council's contractor. We try hard to find the most interesting item that has been abandoned on the estate. Winners are a horse's head mask and a 10-mph speed sign with post

Supermarket trolleys are often left abandoned on our estate. We use an App (Trolleywise) to report them, and the company comes from Bristol to collect and return them to the relevant store.

Conclusion

It has been another successful year. The Facebook group membership has grown. We have seen new faces at our summer events and the Halloween and Christmas decoration competition are going from strength to strength. Plans for 2024 include Frog and Toad Safaris and Bat Walks and well as gatherings on the green during the summer with children's activities.

Gardening Update

After a long cold wet winter the weather is finally improving and the raised beds are beginning to bloom with plenty of forget-me-nots and then daisies to follow. The community gardeners are concentrating on weeding and also getting cuttings and seedlings (sunflowers, calendula, marigolds, snapdragons, hollyhocks, lavatera and mesembryanthemums - currently in the greenhouse and assorted warm window ledges) ready to go into the beds. Hopefully it will mean there will be plenty of flowers this

summer to attract bees and butterflies. Ecology Update

After a quiet winter, it is great to see the birds returning and nesting. In our garden for the first time since we moved in the blue tits have been coming to the feeders. We have even seen a wren on one of our flowerpots, as well as out on the estate. Earlier this month we took the endoscope around and checked the hedgehog and bird boxes

On Friday 21st April we held the first bat walk of the year, despite the late spring and it still being cold we saw plenty of bats at the by-pass end of the estate.

Street Murals in the Library Gardens Street Parish Council working in partnership with Street Library Trust and Mendip District Council commissioned 4 exciting new murals for the wall of the Library Gardens (BA16 OHA) from talented local artist Jonathan Minshull. Funding for the project came from a



Mendip Creative grant and a smaller grant from a local charitable trust. The four murals depict the history of Street from shoemaking, farming, quarrying and peat cutting. The second phase is now being undertaken by the Parish where the two pavilions and being repaired and decorated.
