The year 2005 promises to be an exciting and challenging one as the existing operations move from what has been their home for the last 50 years into a brand new, state-of-the-art distribution centre named Westway.

The existing buildings, of Bullmead, Cowmead, Woodsgate and Maple have served the business extremely well over the last half a century and it is through this book that we attempt to look back at the people, machinery and systems that have made them so successful.

From its conception and opening in 1955, along with numerous extensions in latter years, Bullmead has been the main distribution centre on the site servicing the UK retail and wholesale businesses along with, at certain times, our International customers.

Cowmead which opened in August 1957 was originally a raw materials warehouse – storing leathers and components for the numerous Clarks' factories located in the UK and Ireland.

Woodsgate was originally built in 1969 to act as a storage and distribution facility for the retail business.

However, more recently both Cowmead and Woodsgate have been utilised as distribution centres for the International business.

Maple, opened in 1960 and it was here that lasts, knives and patterns used for shoe manufacturing were originally made. It was named from the Canadian Maple wood used for making the lasts.

The departure from Houndwood and move into Westway promises to be a hugely exciting time for all those involved but it is important to recall the very important role that Houndwood has played over the last 50 years.





The following pictures are from the Clarks Comments book 1960-69, they will tell you in picture form what would have happened to a shoe from the time it enters Bullmead Warehouse to the time it leaves and is on its way to the shoe store.



Each day up to 60,000 pairs of shoes are received from Clarks factories. They are checked in carefully so that a computer stock record can be accurately updated.



Clarks make 40,000 different styles, colours, sizes and fittings in shoes. The people putting the shoes away must remember where each one goes. There are over 2,000,000 pairs in stock at any one time.



If the space for a particular shoe is full, the surplus is taken to the random storage area on the floor above. It can be drawn from here later.

When an order is received the computer releases it to the warehouse in invoice form ready for assembly and packing. Here invoices are sorted and address labels attached so that goods can be handled geographically in the order in which the delivery vehicles depart.






Far left: Orders are packed in cartons except when there are only a few pairs in which case they are wrapped as parcels. A fast packer will achieve 4,500 pairs per day.

Near left: ...those due for delivery receive a final checking...




Left: ...and then are loaded onto the vehicle that will take them to the regional centre from which they are finally delivered to the shop.




