

Newsletter Autumn 2017


Dear Neighbour, a lot has happened since our last newsletter at the start of the summer and we hope to update you with this edition and also encourage you to tell us your views and get involved.

Houndwood scores double win in gardening competition

The Houndwood Community Group and our very own Green Warrior, Jacqui Pirrie, were recognised by Knightstone Housing for our work on community gardens in September.

The Group received first place in the "Blooming Marvellous Competition" across Knightstone's estates in the South West. Jacqui was also awarded first prize as "Green Warrior" for her work in organising and coordinating a band of committed residents. She has encouraged the establishment and planting of communal gardens, replacement and maintenance of the planters on the entrance to estate and organised regular litter picks and general

upkeep activities across the whole estate.

SpeedWatch: How fast is too fast?

Many of you have told us you think that traffic is too fast on the estate. Many are also not sure of the speed limit is currently and what it should be. The limit is 20 mph throughout so we ran a number of Speedwatch sessions, with support from the local Police, to find out how fast the traffic really is.

We checked the speed of 1,250 cars. Of these, 52% were doing less than 14 mph, 90% less than 20 mph. The remaining 10% were doing the speed limit or just above. Two were significantly above 20 mph and were reported to the Police. The Speedwatch team have been surprised by how large cars or vans appear to be going faster than actually are when scanned.

Polite Parking

We all know that there is insufficient parking on the estate for residents' cars, especially when we have visitors.

We need to be tolerant of each other here, since most of us or our visitors are guilty of not parking in an approved slot, or using visitors slots even though we are residents.

When parking on paths, principally on Couture Grove, please leave a 1-metre clear space on the path to enable wheelchairs, pushchairs and mobility scooters to pass and not force them onto the road. Thank you.
